If no extra heat is added, the air will be much colder after expansion. If the heat generated during compression can be stored and used during expansion, then the efficiency of the storage improves considerably. There are several ways in which a CAES system can deal with heat. Air storage can be adiabatic, diabatic, isothermal, or near-isothermal.

CAES systems can store energy for much longer periods compared to battery storage systems, making them particularly suitable for applications requiring extended energy supply.
